STEP 1: CHOOSE A FORMAT

Accountability Group Writers meet to discuss progress on their writing

Feedback Group Writers provide and discuss feedback on one or more writers' drafts

Write-Together Group Writers set writing goals at the beginning of the meeting and spend several hours writing

3 STEPS FOR LAUNCHING WRITING GROUPS



STEP 2: PLAN LOGISTICS

- When, where, and how often will the groups meet?
- How many members can participate in a group?
- What is the role of the facilitator in this group?
- How should a typical meeting be structured?
- What are the deadlines and policies for attendance?
- For feedback groups: How are drafts shared? What is the target document length?

The writing group helps me focus my whole week around what to bring to our Friday session. This event is the single most important thing I do for my research and writing.

STEP 3: POSITION STUDENT WRITERS TO LEAD GROUPS

- Participants collectively set policies and norms
- to each other
- among participants



Lines of accountability are
