# Where we've been

## **Active Learning Classrooms (ALCs) at Mason**



Mason continues to reimagine learning spaces on our campuses to foster increased student engagement through active and collaborative learning. This commitment is part of our strategic plan goals for innovative learning and supporting teaching and scholarship excellence.

With the addition of eight new Active Learning Classrooms (ALCs) in Peterson Hall in Spring 2018 and one in Buchanan Hall in Fall 2019, Mason now has **20 classrooms intentionally designed** to support active learning. The new Core Campus building will offer 27 additional ALCs. As part of this initiative we have created an iterative design process that leverages feedback from faculty and students teaching and learning in these spaces.





### **Research Methods**

This poster highlights findings about faculty experiences teaching in Mason's ALCs. Near the end of each semester from Fall 2015 through Spring 2019, online surveys were sent to all faculty teaching in one of Mason's designated ALCs. In total, these data represent responses from 971 faculty from across the years; each term, 120-164 unique faculty responded; response rates for the survey administrations ranged from 53% to 69%. The findings presented here are based on compiled data from all semesters (except Fall 2017), collected and analyzed by the Learning Environments Assessment Group (LEAG) at Mason.

# What we know

## Instructors see how students benefit from ALCs

- More participation: 24% of instructors reported that student attendance was higher in the ALC than in a regular classroom (n=971)
- More engagement: 47% of instructors reported that student engagement was higher in the ALC than in a regular classroom (n=971)
- More variety: Most faculty used the ALCs in multiple ways throughout the semester to create active and collaborative learning environments.

### Fairfax Campus: Core Campus Building **Opening 2021**

27 new university classrooms, from smaller 24seat classrooms to larger 72-, 90-, and 120seat classrooms, all designed to support active learning and student interaction.

Coming in 2020: Join Stearns Center workshops on teaching in ALCs and get certified to teach in large (>55 students) ALCs.
